KENTUCKY TRAGEDY. Ex-Congressman Colson Charged With Killing Three Men. FEUD STARTED IN SPANISH WAR.

The Trouble Between Colonel Colson and Lieutenant Scott Culminated in a Shooting at a Frankfort Hotel—Two Spectators Were Killed. Frankfort, Ky., Jan. 17.—Eitelbert Scott, Luther Demaree and Charles Julian were killed and Captain B. B. Golden and Harry McWing wounded by Ex-Congressman William Colson yesterday at the Capitol hotel.

When it is remembered that so far as known only two revolvers played a part in the duel, it can be seen that aim was for the most part accurate. Colson's shots were true, but this detracts nothing from the noted skill of Scott, because he emptied his revolver after several bullets had lodged in him.

Following is the record of the marksmen: Scott, a bullet in temple, one in throat, two in lungs, two in back; Demaree, two in heart; Julian, bullet in calf of right leg, bullet in chest; Captain Golden, two bullets in spine; Colson, bullet splintered left arm from wrist to elbow, tearing his cuffs and sleeves to shreds. Nobody not in line of fire was touched.

Colonel Colson has long been a prominent figure in Kentucky politics. He served two terms in congress and declined a renomination at the hands of the Republican party of the Eleventh district in 1898 in order to accept the candidacy for the Fourth Kentucky regiment in the Spanish war.

Many Killed in Dynamite Explosion. Turin, Jan. 17.—A dynamite factory at Avigliano, 14 miles from here, exploded yesterday with the result that five buildings were reduced to ruins, the whole surrounding district was shaken and many houses were badly damaged.

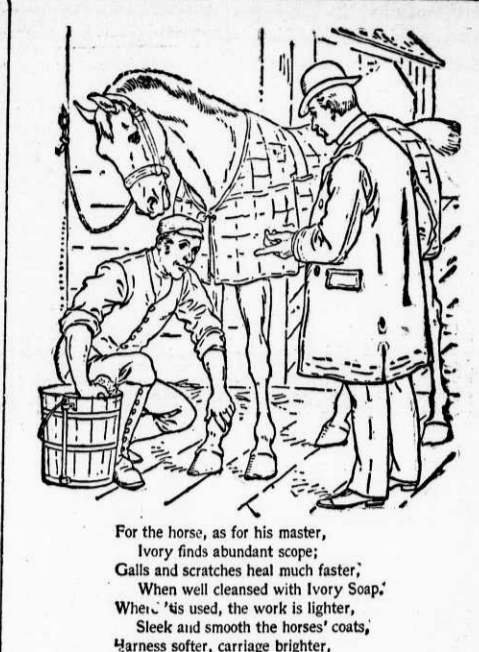
