ouskes will take place in the South and on the Pacific coast, and also in Europe.

During the last two years there have been unusual planetary actions over the Northern Pacific Ocean, especially Japan and China. This powerful attraction contracted that part of the planet, causing earthquakes, volcanic cruptions, and the overflow of the Yellow river, which swept over a large area and drowned thousands of people.

The storm will originate in the Northern Pacific, and it will be the most dangerous on that ocean on account of tidal waves. It will be very heavy in America. One part of it will nove up the Missispip Valley and come down the great lakes, while a northeast current will move over Quebec to meet and welcome it. The gale will be heavy from the southeast and east in the Maritime Provinces and Eastern United States. inces and Eastern United States.
