Large Grist of Divorces.

There was granted in Fairfield county
137 divorces by the superior court
from last October till the end of the
present term, the first of the present
month, which may be said to be the
court year. The number, 137, is a
highwater mark for the county, and
considering the fact that divorces are
not quite so easy to secure as in for-
mer years, the tendency to separa-
tion does not decrease. The following
are the causes on which the divorces
were granted: Desertion 80, adultery
32, cruelty 23, intemperance 14, in-
temperance and cruelty 3, desertion
and cruelty 1, infamous crimes, for
which the defendant has been sent to
state prison 1, annulments 3. Only six
cases have been dismissed.
