COMMERCIAL UTILIZATION OF WATER POWER.

The use of water power for industrial purposes dates back to very ancient times. Crude current wheels were familiar to the Chinese on the Yellow River and to the Hamites on the Nile and Euphrates fully 3,000 years ago. The power thus obtained was generally utilized for raising the water of the Nile for irrigating arid land, and also for grinding grain and other simple applications of an industrial importance in America were made in the New England states, and the textile industry of that territory was destined to expand rapidly, its supporting ally. mining works, and it is probable that over 5000 miles of such ditches were at one time in use in that state for such purposes.

The power from the first developments had necessarily to be used within the limited area to which shafts, belts and ropes could transmit the energy from the water wheels, and had therefore necessarily to be subdivided among a few power houses.

The introduction of the electric system and the evolution in the design of machinery and apparatus, however, have made possible the generation of enormous quantities of power in one station and its transmission for long distances to different localities where it may be most economically disposed of and utilized. During recent years a very large increase in the number and variety of power applications for electric motors has taken place, as for example in agricultural works, irrigation, mining, electric furnaces, railroad electrification, etc.—E. A. Loef, in Engineering Magazine.
